A,B,C	<p>A,B & C NGOs were addressing an acute issue of mainstreaming the disabled rural children into regular schools and providing them timely medical interventions. This leads to empowering them and reducing the stigma associated with PwDs. These project needs to be continued till all the PwDs in the geographical area are identified and rehabilitated.</p> <p>Since all the three NGOs are delivering similar services, the outcomes could be consolidated and reported. A standard reporting template to be evolved for the 3 NGOs to capture outputs and outcomes.</p> <p>A comparative study of the 3 NGOs to be done to evaluate the effectiveness of each of the NGO and decide on future support</p>
D	<p>D should report on the performance of the trainers and the number of disabled they have reached. This will enable the foundation to capture the direct impact on the lives of the PwDs through the support extended to AMBA.</p> <p>A reporting format to be prepared and sent to the NGOs to capture the relevant outputs and outcomes.</p> <p>An SROI reporting could be attempted by the next year if above data is available</p>
E	<p>Started initially for the PwDs this project is being extended to rural youth also. A need assessment to be done by E and report on the further availability of PwDs in the surrounding villages.</p> <p>To continue the project if a significant number of PwDs are identified or shift it to livelihoods project for youth where more courses can be offered. Otherwise the project support could be stopped as the desired impact is not being met</p>
